My parents moved from Willard Utah to Cherry Creek. When was about seven years old. I attended school in Cherry Creek and in Malad.

Church positions which I have held are: Superintendent of the Sunday School in the Cherry Creek Ward when I was seventeen years old. President of the Mutual of the Cherry Creek Ward for four years. Was married in 1899 on Oct. 25 in the Salt Lake Temple to Ann Jones. Lived in Pleasantview for one year and a half. In the ~~XXXXX~~ spring of 1901 we moved to Henderson creek. In that year 1901 was made second Counselor in the Bishopric to George H. Facer.. In 1903, I was made Bishop of the Cherry Creek ward. This position I held ~~XXX~~ until 1912. I was then made a member of the Religious Class board of the Stake. The latter part of the year of 1901 I was set apart as a Stake High Councilman. I held this position for nineteen years, and a half. Since that time I have been ~~XXX~~ an acting teacher. I have served as a Sunday School Teacher in all the Different classes for a total of thirty three years. I have done a lot of temple work. I ne missed going to the temple each year for thirty ^{FIVE} years. My wife and I were called on a temple mission to the Logan Temple. My special interest in music: I played for dances my father when I was about ten years old. I played different instruments, the guitar, cornet, organ, piano, violin and the bass vile. I played all over the Malad Valley with my brothers, Evan and Will. Later I belonged to an Orchestra

I have been a farmer and stock raiser all my life. In the younger years I freighted from Challis, Idaho from Malad. I spent some time working at Wisdom and Butte, Mont.

I have lived on the farm where I first settled for fifty five years. In 1949 Oct 25, my wife and I celebrated our Golden Wedding. Open house was held at my Soninlaws and daughter's home in Malad. We were honored by our children and friends. Over three hundred friends and relatives called to wish us well on that day. We are ~~XXX~~ the parents of Eight children, five boys and three girls.
